15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Being a Constituent college, the course structure and the contents (course curriculum) are designed by the parent university, Patliputra University, a state university, which is yet to implement the Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary approach fully.

The college is carving out the way for the fruitful implementation of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary education, which will enable students to develop the skills required in the 21st century. While more clarity will be visible in the coming months on how the multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approach to education being proposed in the Policy shape up, the college welcomes the change and is ready to implement the same.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The college's preparedness to implement Academic Bank of Credits solely depends upon the guidelines of the University and Higher Education Department, Government of Bihar. Provisions of the Academic bank of Credit proposed in the NEP 2020 are to facilitate multiple entries and exit points in the academic programs. This is an innovative idea to earn and deposit credits through National schemes like SWAYAM, NPTEL, etc., leading to credit transfer and accumulation, which will help the students to get the program completed. While more clarity will be visible in the coming months on how the academic bank of credits being proposed in the policy shape up, the college welcomes the change, which is to create a framework for the country to take advantage of its demographical dividend.

17.Skill development:

Skill Enhancement Courses or Ability Enhancement Courses such as Computer & ICT, Web Designing, Derivatives and Risk Management, Solid Waste Management, Mushroom Technology, Bio-fertilizer Technology, Environment Law and Policy, Tourism and Hospitality Management, Life and Communication Skill Development, Yogic Sciences are included as compulsory courses in the syllabus.

The College ensures appropriate integration of the Indian knowledge

system by following the CBCS scheme set up by Parent University. The College has provision of various courses that contribute to sensitizing students to cross-cutting issues like Gender, Environmental Sustainability, Human Values and Professional Ethics for the development of creative and divergent competencies. Subjects like the Indian Constitution, Ethics & Value system of Indian culture, Environment Eco-system, etc., are offered to inculcate a sense of national integration, culture and a civic sense among the student community. The College teaches degree courses in local languages along with the English language as it runs multidisciplinary courses approved by University.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The objectives set out in the NEP 2020 on OBE are competency, standards, benchmarks, and attainment of targets. In addition to this, the OBE incorporates three elements, (i) Theory of Education, (ii) Systematic Structure of Education, and (iii) specific approach to instructional practice. The faculty members have made efforts in the Institute to fulfill the objectives and achieve the target as per the structural curriculum provided by the university. Various approaches in the teaching-learning process like lectures, seminars, tutorials/workshops/practical and project-based learning fieldwork and technology-enabled learning have been adopted. In addition to conventional teaching and learning activities, skill-based training is imparted for First/Second/Third-semester students of all branches for enhancement of their professional skills in the emerging area of technologies in such a way that students can fulfill professional assignments afterwards.

20.Distance education/online education:

During the COVID pandemic, online classes were conducted very effectively by all the faculty members in all subjects, helping the students to take classes online and study e-contents of all subjects. Both faculties and students have experienced the online teaching and evaluation process through different software. The college is also preparing to make available all such types of e-content materials prepared by faculty members to all students through online mode to meet future challenges. Some of the e-content is available on the college as well as the university website.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Slow Learners:

Additional tutorials and remedial classes are conducted to give special coaching in areas where they need support. Additional reading material and books in the simple form are made available to increase their understanding of the subject. E-links are also suggested to the students to help them gain in-depth knowledge of the subject. Bilingual explanations and discussions are done in the class with the aim of reaching out to the slow learners so that they can be brought at par with the rest of the class.

Personal, academic and career-related counselling is given from time to time. Home assignments are given and evaluated on a regular basis. Additional tests are conducted outside the curriculum to assess the learning ability of students.

Peer learning is encouraged through group discussions and presentations. This aids in building a culture of team work and helps to develop leadership as well as interpersonal skills.

Advanced Learners:

During lectures, tutorials, class tests, assignments and interactions outside the class, the teachers are able to assess the calibre of the students and identify the advanced learners.

Departments, through academic and co-curricular activities, encourage advanced learners to optimize their potential. Such students are encouraged to participate in inter-college competitions.

They are suggested advanced readings on the relevant topics to enhance their understanding of the subject to enable them to pursue research in future.

ICT has enabled better and swifter communication; presentation of ideas in an effective and relevant way. It is an effective tool for acquiring information from multiple sources to help students to enhance their knowledge database.

The College has a Wi-Fi Enabled Campus, which helps the teachers and students to stay connected to the internet and learn and teach updated information. The college has ICT Enabled Classrooms having Desktops, Laptops, and Projectors, which help in the e-learning process. Some teachers use and share E-books which are very useful for the students as they are handy and save the cost of buying physical books.

The college has an Automated Library, which enables the students to find the location of the books easily.

The college has well-equipped Computer Labs. Teachers make and present PowerPoint presentations in the classrooms which help them have an interactive conversation with the students. Presentations

The schedules of internal assessments are communicated to students and faculty at the beginning of the academic year through the academic calendar, which is prepared based on the university's academic calendar. Before a week internal exam time-table is displayed on the notice board. Questions are framed such that they adhere to university standards. The subject-handling faculty prepares a question bank that covers an equal number of questions from each unit, covering all the topics. The departmental internal exam coordinator, under the guidance of the HOD, checks for

the standard of the question bank. The internal exam coordinator ensures the smooth conduction of tests and proper valuation of the internal exams. At the end of each academic year, examinations are conducted by the affiliating University.

- 3. Institutional Examination and Tests: Students are assessed and evaluated throughout the year at the institutional level through unit test, surprise tests, terminal examinations and the student's performance is analyzed for assessing the attainment level of programme outcomes and programme-specific outcomes.
- 4. Feedback Evaluation: The Institution collects feedback from students, Alumni, Employers and Parents, which is an important method of measuring attainment with the objectives of identifying the attainment level of students in terms of programme, subject, course and syllabus outcomes to understand the impact of teaching-learning process.

Internal Audit: Internal audit is a continuous process which ensues after each and every financial transaction, whereby the college itself carries out the initial stage of the internal audit.

In the initial stage, the officer in charge scrutinizes and verifies the financial data. This is again scrutinized by the Administrative Officer and the Principal for clarity, authenticity, transparency and financial accuracy. Income/expenditure is closely monitored by the Bursar and the Principal. The proper procedure for purchases is adopted. Quotations are called for, and prices are compared. The Institution has formed a Purchase Committee for this purpose.

For the grants received from the UGC, utilization certificates are prepared according to the allowed expenditure under various heads. The Utilisation Grant Certificates are annually submitted to UGC.

The external audit takes place annually after the completion of every financial year. The Chartered Accountant, who works as an auditor, is appointed by the College. The bills and vouchers of the revenue expenditure are checked. The vouchers and proper records with the concerned Department of capital expenditure are also checked and verified. The Utilisation Grant Certificates are audited by an external auditor.

The College authorities and the teachers have reported advising the student community to deposit their food waste into the bio-bins. Waste food management was thus effectively carried out in schools where space is a limiting factor. The plastic and e-wastes that are quite difficult to be managed were collected and distributed to agencies that deal with e-waste management. The skill enhancement course on plastic reuse has enabled the student community to make beautiful products from worn-out plastics, thus promoting plastic recycling. Several saplings are planted at regular intervals by students and staff in 'tree plantation programmes organized by the college, and these plants are taken care of by the gardener. The college campus has been declared as a 'Plastic free Zone'. So use of the plastic bag is avoided and usage of jute bags and cotton bags

are motivated. Water conservation is done through rain-water harvesting.
